INTRODUCTION:

The Marape/Rosso government has approved in the Parliament for a Special Parliamentary Committee (SPC) to assess and evaluate National General Elections 2022 (NGE22) and help to prepare for an improved electoral cycle before 2027 NGE.

The Committee has set about collecting information through interviews and presentations by various stakeholders in elections in this country.

We in Chimbu as a province would also like to offer some of our recommendations which we think to be the best that the Committee can look at and may also adopt to be included for a much improved electoral mechanism workable for PNG

SOME FACT ABOUT CHIMBU PROVINCE:

1. Electorates: Chimbu has 6 Open Electorates. The Regional seat allows for Chimbu to send 7 MPs to the parliament

2. LLG: Chimbu has 20 LLGs. They are listed as in the table shown;

- 3. Wards: Chimbu has a total of 315 Rural Wards and 2 Urban Wards giving a total of 317 wards in the province
- 4. NGE22, Chimbu returned 7 writs successfully.
- 5. Budget: A budget was carefully formulated taking into account all activities starting with Voter Education (awareness) to the Return of Writ. The total budgeted to administer election 2022 was at 7.7 million kina
- Total funded to the province was close to 5 million Kina. These were expended to administer the elections, pay off outstanding service providers
- 7. Simbu Provincial Government has assisted us with K111,000.00. Funds used and acquittal done and given
- 8. Some DDA's assisted with some funds during the roll update. These was given direct to RO/AROs to assist with their work. Acquittals for all assistance were done and given back to Districts under my supervision.
- 9. Service Providers for NGE22: Up to 99% of service providers were settled. Only a handful missed out as a result of having wrong bank account details. When we wanted to settle these, election was over, funds depleted therefore they missed out. We hope to save some funds during LLG election to sort this out
- 10. Provincial Electoral Office: The provincial election office has the Election Manager and Assistant Election Manager as full time officers. The four main support staff are engaged on casual basis. However, they are very supportive administratively

		 In the near future, bio data of electors updated, polling done electronically. These machines would already do the count as well. These technologies are available and I have witnessed it in South Korea and may be India as well. Only then, election in PNG will not be corrupted. personnel responsible for corrupting roll update must arrested and charged for their criminal deeds. Intending candidates must be exempted from contesting as well
2	Funding/Budget:	 Provincial electoral offices must be funded fully in the 5 years than wait for the election year only when funds are being released One year before the elections, funds must be released tied strictly to activities. Election officials misusing must be arrested, charged and disciplined. There must be a provision enacted for how much provincial governments and DDAs can assist with election matters. Not we requesting them and receive negative or nil responses from them Trust accounts in NGE22 was very helpful. 3	TEW Data Base:	 A data base must be created for Temporary Election Workers (TEW) at both the provincial and HQ level. Same people who work in elections must be maintained. Experiences over time helps with delivery good election results.
