Elections are one of the most important events in the PNG political calendar. held every five years, they are a chance for the people of Papua New Guinea to choose their representatives and government. The Electoral Commission of Papua New Guinea is an independent body that oversees all aspects of the election process. It is responsible for ensuring that elections are free and fair and that the rules and regulations are followed.

Having said that, elections are not easy to run these days as compared to some 10 to 15 years ago. I believe not only in NCD but all across the Nation. Many factors contribute to this contention;

- Rural-Urban drift
- Increase population
- Law and order issues
- The global effects of global warming
- The declining economy and
- Many other issues affecting elections in the National Capital

As you all know, NCD is comprised of a multi-cultural community, people with all walks of life, beliefs, customs and norms. Five teams (5) polling teams (Ward 9 B – MNE Team No. 137-141) refrained from polling after the ATS shooting. In consultation with the

Security Personnel, the tension was still high hence we were unable to re-deploy for re-poll.

196 Teams successfully polled.

Counting

PNGEC, with its quest to improve election operations we have introduced LLG Count in a Centralized counting center.

Election results

Live results were also transmitted through our PNGEC website for public consumption on real time directly from the respective count centers.

CCTVs (x3 each Count centers) also used during the counting for the first time.

NCD Regional delayed due to intermittent interruptions by candidate scrutineers. However, it was eventually declared in early September 2022.

Partners In Elections

PESC (Provincial Election Steering Committee)

- The partnership is with the intention to share resources and election cost.
- Appointment of Returning Officers and Assistant Returning Officers. Recommendations are tabled and submitted to SMT/Electoral Commissioner for official appointment.

Temporary Election Workers

- ♣ Enrolment We still have outstanding allowances to be paid due to redeployment of teams and the extended period of Data entry process as a result of (ICT) technical issues.
- ♣ Polling Due to personal bank account issues of TEWs, the delay in payments from Kundupei has taken longer frustrating a lot of TEWs.
- Counting LLG count has seen increased number of counting officials.
 Eg. MNE has more than 800 officials with payments more than K2m.

Recommendations

- ♣ Enrolment Eviction exercise has greater impact on the management of electoral with voters migrating to a new location (Transfer-in and Transfer-Out).
- It is incumbent on the PNGEC Management to employ a credible management and plan for improving the electoral roll. In its neonatal stages, are Biometrics and Photo Roll.
- Delay in disbursement of elections funds continue to affect our preparations and operations
- LLG Counting is logistically complex and attracts a lot of resources.

 PNGEC has to adopt strategies that would improve the scrutiny process.
